

Prayer Team Member

Mission

The prayer team handles a diverse spectrum of prayer requests from the congregation after each service, providing a compassionate experience that shows the love of God through both one-on-one prayer and through effective referrals to other relevant ministries at Journey of Faith that someone may benefit from.

Specific Responsibilities

As an extension of the pastoral team and Care Ministries department, prayer team member responsibilities include:

- Public Prayer Be available after select services to pray with those who come forward after each service, including referring those in need to either our pastoral staff or Guest Services if an additional need is mentioned.
- Ongoing Development Continue to grow as a spiritual leader through regular prayer team training, and personal accountability with our prayer team leader and pastoral staff. We continually acknowledge that our outward ministry is strengthened by our inward desire to continually learn from others, as well as through our ongoing personal walk with Jesus.
- Growing the Ministry Intentionally seek out and encourage potential new prayer team members to be evaluated and trained for prayer team ministry. Once identified, refer the potential new prayer team member to the prayer team leader for further recruitment.

Spiritual Requirements

- Be a committed Jesus-follower with a lifestyle and reputation of Christian faithfulness.
- Be in agreement with the Mission, Values, and Core Beliefs of Journey of Faith.
- Have a high level of self-awareness and be committed to continual relational growth.
- Demonstrate Christ-centered living (1 Pet. 1:15-16; 1 Tim. 3:1-7; Tit. 1:5-9), Honesty (Col. 3:9, Eph. 4:25), confidence (2 Cor. 3:5-6), teachability (Pr. 1:5), humility (Phil. 2:5-7), patience (Phil. 4:6; Jas. 5:8), and commitment in working with others (Rom. 15:5-6).

Ministry Specific Requirements:

- Be an active and supportive congregant at Journey of Faith for at least 6 months, and currently attend Sunday services at Journey of Faith.
- Have a strong capability to assist emotionally vulnerable people in a one on one setting.
- Be willing and have the ability to actively participate in regular prayer team meetings, which include training, support, ministry planning, and personal accountability.
- Work from and in concert with any method or system used for team organization.
- Pursue and model Christ-like integrity in your private and public life.

Reporting:

Works with the pastoral team and is accountable to the prayer team leader.

Time Commitment:

20 minutes after a service
